

LETTER FROM REV. TIM

Dear friends,

This year we have an interesting confluence of themes on February 14. On the one hand, it is Ash Wednesday, the traditional beginning of the Lenten season of self-examination and repentance. And that, as I often say, is more than just contrition and penitence. It requires a revolution in our thinking. I believe that is what Christ is getting at when he begins his ministry in Mark's gospel by proclaiming, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God (the reign of God – God's way of doing things; i.e. thy will be done) has come near; repent, (that is re-think, reevaluate your fundamental assumptions about how the world works) and believe (not intellectual assent to certain doctrine, but trust that enables us to have peace of mind, that gives us courage to act) in the good news." Something that deserves far more than a season of forty days.

On the other hand, it is also Valentine's Day, the annual commemoration of romance and mush, that enriches the sellers of cards and flowers and chocolate. Given that coincidence, it seems good to me to think a little bit about St. Valentine who has given his name to the day. On the one hand, that is a little confusing, because depending on your source there are several St. Valentines, and many tales of his marvelous deeds. But the Valentine that comes to my mind right now was a Christian priest, who persistently defying orders from the emperor Claudius Gothicus, performed weddings for couples, thus allowing the husbands involved to escape conscription into the pagan army. For that crime against the state, he was executed outside the Flaminian Gate on February 14, 269 A.D.

What is particularly interesting to the language nerd in me is the root of that name in Latin – *valens*, meaning strong, vigorous, healthy. Related also to the words valiant and valor. And the Roman greeting, *vale*, "Be well!" Or the one that was drummed into me in eight grade Latin class, *Si vales*, *valeo* – "If you are well, I am well."


Canvas any size. Pre primed

Minutes of Governing Board Meeting January 22, 2024

- 1. Meeting called to order by President Jankowski at 6:31 p.m.
- 2. Rev. Tim opened with prayer.
- 3. Agenda approved with addition of "Member Recruitment" under Unfinished Business.
- 4. Consent Agenda was approved minus Finance, Building and Grounds, and Member Care.
- A. **Finance Committee:** In response to the H & S Review of FCC's financial accounting systems, Rev. Tim published a one page summary of the findings in the *Pilgrim Post* of January, 2024. Governing Board now directs the church Treasurer (Deb Collett) to review each completed bank reconciliation, holding the preparer accountable for timely reconciliations and all outstanding bank activity. "Preliminary Monthly Financial Report for December 2023" was distributed with explanation from Deb Collett. (See Treasurer's Report.)
- B. **Building and Grounds** minutes from December 18 were distributed and accepted with no further discussion.
 - C. Two motions were passed as recommended by **Member Care**:

MOTION PASSED to accept transfer of membership for Daniel Barnum Steggerda to FCC

MOTION PASSED to move Tom Woirol to inactive status in the membership rolls.

<u>President's Report:</u> Eddie expressed appreciation for Rev. Kristen Orion's filling in during Rev. Tim's vacation as well as noting upcoming major musical events and other activities on the church calendar.

Minister's Report: Tim also expressed appreciation for Rev. Orion's involvement during his absence.

At Tim's request a <u>MOTION PASSED</u> regarding Tim's submitting a letter of support requesting that Muskegon County Cooperating Churches become the fiduciary for the Sacred Suds program, formerly part of the dissolving Community enCompass program.

New Business:

- A. Jefferson Towers: MOTION PASSED to approve appointment of three new members to Jefferson Towers Board: Roy Winegar, Dollie Hippchen, Virginia Taylor.
- B. Consent agenda format for conducting meetings will continue to be used with the clerk responsible for developing a more instructional monthly agenda to aid board members in following it.

Income exceeded expenses for the month of December by \$9,011. A gift of \$10,000 from the Shaw & Betty Walker Foundation was received in December and specified to be used in general operations. Miscellaneous Income continues to be higher than budgeted expectations year-to-date.

Year-to-date, we have drawn less from Endowment funds for use in operations than budgeted expectations. Actual income and expenses both remain below budget expectations.
