LETTER FROM REV. TIM

Dear friends,

My how time marches on. As I was preparing to write this letter, I read an article about the limited access just being opened up to residents and businesses of Lahaina after the wildfire devastation a month and a half ago.

In the days immediately after the fires our Missions and Service department began to get questions about how we might help. I went to the webpage of the Hawai'i Conference of the UCC for ideas. One of the first things that jumped out at me is that there are almost as many UCC churches in Hawai'i as there are in Michigan. Of course it only took a little bit of digging into the history of missionary activity in the Hawai'ian Island to uncover why. Our original intention was to channel funds raised in this congregation directly to the Hawai'i Conference, but they have since asked us to direct gifts for the wildfire relief to the National Office of the UCC https://support.ucc.org/hawaii-wildfires

You are certainly welcome to give directly, but we are also making this our Mission of the Month here at FCC/UCC. If you wish to donate to the cause, you can make a gift earmarked for that to us, and we will look at what we have received, consider matching it from our Mission funds, and send one check to the national appeal.

Of course we have heard of disaster after catastrophe after disaster here in the U.S.A. and around the world since then, and we will be lifting up opportunities to respond to them through our annual Neighbors in Need and One Great Hour of Sharing appeals on down the road.

GOVERNING BOARD NOTES

Meeting was called to order by President Eddie Jankowski at 6:36 pm.

Opening Prayer was offered by Rev. Vander Haar.

Agenda was approved with item A: check Signers under new business removed.

Minutes approved without corrections.

President's Report Eddie reported that McGovern's used our dishwasher for Irish Fest. They thanked the church and will pay \$400.

Minister's Report Because we have more and more events at the church, Rev. Tim would like to make sure everyone reads each department's minutes before coming to the Governing Board meetings. This way we only need to talk about items that need to have approval on an actionable item.

Treasurer's Report: The second month of the fiscal year ended with positive net revenue of \$430. Stewardship is still active. We did need to take \$10,000 from Endowments to support cash flow, however, this is under the \$15,750 budgeted amount.

Building and Grounds, Congregational Life, Missions and Service, and Worship and Music all submitted reports, no action needed.

Christian Education Motion was made by Shirley Albers and seconded by Marty Lalick to approve that Deanne Hannibal be appointed to the Christian Education Department. Motion passed.

Member Care Motion was made by Barb Klingenmaier to approve Kathleen Freeman for membership. Roy Portenga seconded the motion. Motion approved. Welcome Kathleen!

Unfinished Business

Roy Portenga reviewed any questions that the Board had on the revised by laws. A motion was made by Roy Portenga and seconded by Caroly Spink, that was carried was the restated by-laws that were sent out by Ann Taylor in August was adopted with the following changes:

- 1. Article 1.3 on page one has the word "(modified)" added
- 2. 1.3 on page two has the words his and him when referring to Jesus capitalized.
- 3. 3.2.1 on page 5 has the following sentence added: "In no event shall a past President who is not a continuing member of Governing Board serve consecutive years on Governing Board in that capacity."
- 4. 3.5 and 3.5.3: the Department of Mission and Service shall be known as the Department of Missions and Service.
- 5. 3.5.4: the language under the heading will read: "This department shall be responsible for managing and maintaining the upkeep of the physical properties of the Church. It shall advise the Governing Board regarding necessary improvements and repairs that require approval.
- 6. 3.5.6: the words through "various means including" calling.... will be added.
- 7. 4.2: the word church will be capitalized.
- 8. 5.1: the words Department and Committee will not be capitalized.

An announcement will be made from the pulpit that we have revised our by-laws and will need to have Congregational approval at the Congregational meeting on October 22, 2023, to enact the changes. A copy will be made available by request either electronically or on paper.

Expenses exceeded income for the month of August by \$1,592, while year-to-date income continues to exceed expenses by \$430. Actual income and expenses both underperformed budget expectations.

Income continues to come in lower than budgeted, primarily due to our pledge goal of \$320,000 not yet being met.

A transfer of \$10,000 from Endowment funds to operations was made due to cash flow concerns. However, our budget expectation was that up to \$15,750 would be needed this month, allowing us to leave the difference in our invested funds.
