LETTER FROM REV. TIM

Dear friends,

I am writing to talk a little bit about our Mission of the Month for August, the organization known as Muskegon County Cooperating Churches. MCCC traces it's roots to the founding in 1941 of the Muskegon County Council of Churches. And we (First Congregational) were there.

Over the years MCCC has been involved in many projects for the benefit of the community:

- Working with PTA's to provide milk to school children during WWII
- Providing vacation bible school resources and training for Sunday School teachers
- Sponsoring choir workshops and pulpit exchanges
- Coordinating weekly religious services at Brookhaven
- Working with social services as part of the Goose Egg Lake Project to organize a preschool program and a clinic
- Facilitating a jail/prison ministry led for 20 years by the Rev. Ed Rogers
- Helping to start Foster Grandparents, and Muskegon Country Habitat for Humanity
- Helping to organize the Westshore Jewish/Christian Dialogue (now the West Michigan Academic Consortium)
- Bringing into being the Westshore Dispute Resolution Center, which has grown into the Mediation and Restorative Services for Muskegon, Oceana, Mason and Manistee Counties
- Creating in Muskegon an Institute for Healing Racism
- Continuing to be very involved in addressing Food Insufficiency through scheduling and assisting with Mobile Food Pantries throughout the Muskegon area, and providing oversight for the annual CROP hunger walk.

One of our members, Dr. Billy Page, was very active, serving as President, and he and I helped write the current mission statement:

Moved by the love of Christ, we seek reconciliation and justice for all, reaching across barriers that divide to alleviate poverty, both spiritual and physical.

Offices for MCCC and for several of the organizations it fostered were for a number of years at "the Yellow House" which we maintained across the street where our Saturday Breakfast Garden is now located. The Peace and Justice Committee of MCCC is organizing a Prayer Walk Against Gun Violence on August 27. Please see the notice about that elsewhere in this Post.

Meeting was called to order by President, Shirley Albers at 6:30 p.m.

Opening Prayer was given by Rev. Vander Haar.

Agenda and minutes of the June meeting were approved by consensus.

President's Report – Shirley Albers stated, "it has been a pleasure to serve you and thank each of you that has served on the Governing Board this year."

Election of Officers:

President: Marty Lalick nominated Eddie Jankowski. Patty Kelly seconded. Nomination approved.

Vice President: Robin Murphy nominated Melissa Wikman. Patty Kelly seconded. Nomination approved.

Clerk: there being no nominations this is tabled until the next meeting.

Treasurer: Deb Collett continues to serve in this position.

Minister's Report: Rev. Tim thanks everyone for all they do for our church. He gave an update on the Bylaw revisions and hopes to have copies of them available for next meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Deb Collett reported that the end of the year report reflected a balanced year end. Originally, the plan was to take up to \$96,977 from our Endowments to meet our needs. However, we only needed \$51,830, thanks to our departments for their careful spending and our income exceeding our plan.

Building and Grounds, Christian Education, Missions and Service, and Worship and Music all submitted reports, no action needed.

Congregational Life Motion made by Roy Winegar and seconded by Robin Murphy to waive the term limit for Marty Lalick as Chair of the Department for one year. Motion passed.

Member Care Recommended that Joel Zuidema be approved for membership. Melissa Wikman seconded. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business- Member Outreach Committee is working on making the facilities more attractive and getting the message out to the community of what we are.

Jefferson Towers: Nothing to report at this time.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:28 p.m.

Income exceeded expenses for the month of June by \$7,810, allowing for a break-even fiscal year end. Year to date income and expenses both under-performed budget expectations. Income was less than expected, primarily due to over \$45K in Endowment funds that were not needed for operations. These funds remain invested.

Expenses were under budget due to the delay of some maintenance projects, careful spending, staff negotiated discounts, and the use of designated funds for some expenses. As a result, our actual year-end net total expenses were \$35,414 under our budgeted expectation for the year.
