GOVERNING BOARD NOTES

Meeting was called to order by President, Eddie Jankowski at 6:30 pm.

Rev. Tim Vander Haar opened with prayer.

Motion was made by Shirley Albers and seconded by Judy Wilcox to elect Donna Lachniet as Clerk. Motion approved.

The August agenda and minutes of July meeting were approved.

<u>President's Report</u> August 20th's Church picnic was well organized and attended, more children than expected. Special thanks to Christian Education for games and clean-up crew.

<u>Minister's Report</u> Rev. Tim echoed Pres. Eddie's remarks on the success of the church picnic. He mentioned he will be on a vacation over Labor Day and has arranged for Kristen Orion to lead worship services on September 3.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> Preliminary Monthly Financial Report for July was reviewed. The first month of the fiscal year ended with positive net revenue of \$2,022. Stewardship campaign has not yet risen over 85% response rate of regular pledgers.

Finance Committee has approved two fundraisers for the Worship and Music Department:

1. Candlelight Concert program

2. Music and Staff Singers program.

Endowment Committee \$41,147 from the Reichert Fund will be used to repair and replace the leaking flat roof sections of the building. \$16,830.33 was withdrawn from the funds invested with the United Church Funds to balance the operating fund at the end of FY22-23.

Building and Grounds Department to refer the Laskco bid for replacing 83 thermostats and installing a digital heating system with a project cost of \$157,919 to Finance/Endowments with the recommendation that the work proceed before the heating season. Motion made by Shirley Albers, seconded by Marty Lalick. Motion passed. Governing Board agrees with B & G to add signage at church entrances to have "No Smoking" within 25 feet of entrances and also add signage indicating that the church building is "Weapons Free." Harley O. will implement.

Christian Education Rev. Tim reported that Gillian Major will be the Sunday School Director and Jessica Krause the Youth Group and GSA Activities Director.

Missions & Service July's Saturday Breakfast served 108 adults and 18 Children with help from 32 volunteers.

The next Governing Board Meeting will be held on Monday, September 18, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. in Fellowship Hall. Any member of FCC may attend.
