LETTER FROM REV. TIM

Dear friends,

Proverbs 3:16 says, "She (wisdom) is a tree of life to those who take hold of her, and happy are all who hold her fast." This tree of life seemed to our Finance and Endowment Committees to be an appropriate image for our shared experience at FCC/UCC. There is so much that has come down to us from those who have gone before, that we are tasked with asking, "What are we going to leave to those who come after?"

In days to come, we are going to be hearing more about watering two branches of that tree of life – one is the need to replenish through a capital campaign that we have used for significant projects this year, and the other is how to grow a legacy for the future, so that we continue to have those resources to draw upon for generations to come. Among other things, there will be a presentation after our worship on Sunday, November 5, bringing us some ideas from those who have the expertise and experience to stimulate our thinking. And as a part of all that, Fred Sanderlin has penned some thoughts we would like to share with you.

TREES.

Along with the primary feature of dunes that fall to a beach and the sounds of waves washing against sand, trees are a preferred attraction in hiking in this country.

The recreation and refreshment of the human spirit is immeasurable on the trails at Hoffmaster. Trees stand in friendly diversity, beech, oak, maple, sassafras, yet are viewed in their interconnectedness when their roots are exposed, entangled on the trails. A forest is not a tree standing alone, immune to its neighbor and the young trees sprouting, angling for more light, or the decomposition of one felled by age or accident of nature. Trees are alive. They sustain each other, the very idea of tree is kept by their communion, and most profoundly they communicate need and abundance through a fibrous network of fungi from the ends of their roots. Each tree is a member of a community looking out for itself and others. It could be viewed ideally as a congregation.

Walk your favorite trails, know a fungus in Oregon is estimated to be 2,400 years old and extends for 2,000 acres. It is the largest known organism in the world. Know, in your hiking, something of true life is underfoot and informing of the wonder of God's creation, praying out our appreciation and gratitude, longing for sustainability. We are wise when we act as trees keeping the forest alive and vibrant.

GOVERNING BOARD NOTES

Meeting was called to order by President Eddie Jankowski at 6:30 pm.

Rev. Tim offered opening prayer.

Agenda was approved with "Adoption of Consent Agenda" added under New Business.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved with the addition of the following words in red in "Section 1.3" of the proposed By-Laws, which wording was approved through the special virtual meeting of the board: "God calls us into the Church to accept the cost and joy of discipleship, to be servants in the service of the whole human family, to proclaim the gospel to all the world and resist the powers of evil, to share in Christ's baptism, communion, passion and victory. God promises to all who trust in the Gospel forgiveness of sins and fullness of grace, courage in the struggle for justice and peace, the presence of the Holy Spirit in trial and rejoicing, and eternal life in that kingdom which has no end."

President's Report: Eddie expressed appreciation for ongoing excellent music in worship and successful bake sale for benefit of the Worship and Music Dept. He also called attention to the importance of completing purple forms for all special programs/activities and communicating with the weekend custodial staff about details and expectations from staff.

Minister's Report: Rev. Tim expressed thanks for the work of the By-Laws Committee and expects By-Laws approval at the October 22 Congregational Meeting. The work of Finance and Endowment Committees was also commended.

Clerk's Report: Donna mentioned two new members were welcomed on October 15: Joel Zuidema and Kathleen Freeman. Sharon Miller requested transfer of membership to a church closer to her home while remaining an Associate member at FCC.

Treasurer's Report: Deb Collett reports that even though there is a YTD income shortfall, projected year-end giving usually bring income and expenses into much closer alliance.

Standing Committee and Department Reports required no action items.

New Business: Roy Winegar's motion that the Governing Board adopt the "Consent Agenda" mode of conducting Governing Board meetings was passed.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m. Next meeting November 20, 2023 at 6:30 p.m.

Expenses exceeded income for the month of September by \$2,644, bringing year-to-date net total to \$ - 2,215. Actual income and expenses both underperformed budget expectations.
