LETTER FROM REV. TIM

Dear friends,

I love the picture on the cover of this month's Pilgrim Post, and I am looking forward with eager anticipation to our Candlelight Concert on the 10th and our Christmas Eve service on the 24th, as well as praying we will not be snowed out again this year. But for most of this month, we are in the season of Advent and I want to share a few thoughts about that, triggered by some words shared in an email and a Facebook meme, both courtesy of Dan Barnum-Steggerda. He signed off one of our e-mail exchanges a while back with the words, "Blessings for today and bright hope for tomorrow." That made me think of the words I always share on the first Sunday of Advent in blessing our Advent Wreath.

I speak of Advent as a time when we prepare for the coming of Christ into the world. I say, "We fix our eyes not just on the Christ who came to Bethlehem so long ago, nor even the Christ who will come again in glory, but also on Emmanuel, God with us gives us hope and fill us with peace and joy and love."

Which brings me to that Facebook meme, taken also from my colleague Dan's page, but credited by him to Fr. Ken Saunders of St. James Episcopal Church in Greenville, Tennessee. He wrote,

Inaccurate eschatology cause the church to:

Wait for a King who already reigns,
Wait for a Kingdom they're already in,
Wait to become what they already are,
Wait for an age that has already come,
Wait for victory that's already been won..

And the upshot of all that is that far too often we wait to do what we should already be doing. That, to me is the challenge of the Advent Season: to ask ourselves what it is that we should be about now, not waiting to get around to sometime down the road. What expressions of that hope and peace and joy and love that are ours by God's grace can we share with those around us? A kind word, thoughts and prayers, certainly, but also things that will bring to them blessings for today and bright hope for tomorrow.

Meeting of November 20, 2023

Meeting was called to order Monday, November 20, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. by President, Eddie Jankowski.

Rev. Tim Vander Haar offered a prayer.

- 1. <u>President's Report:</u> Eddie expressed thanks for all who made the Thanksgiving feast another successful event.
- 2. <u>Minister's Report:</u> Another successful Thanksgiving Feast has led to securing the caterers for next year. Full accounting has not been completed to confirm how many guests are going to be subsidized for their meals.
 - Planning is underway for a celebration of the life of Tom Johnson on December 9. Tom Johnson filled many important roles at FCC over many years of membership, including Governing Board and Motet Choir. This celebration will happen on a day filled with much activity related to the annual Candlelight Service.
- 3. <u>Treasurer's report</u>: Year to Date expenses are \$8,143 over budget with expectation that year-end giving will affect the bottom line positively.
- 4. **New Business:** Approved the Senior Minister to distribute Christmas gifts to staff full and part time on their behalf as budgeted.

MOTION PASSED: Approved Missions and Service to move forward in cooperation with Nelson Neighborhood Improvement Association, as they develop plans for Saturday Breakfast Garden.
