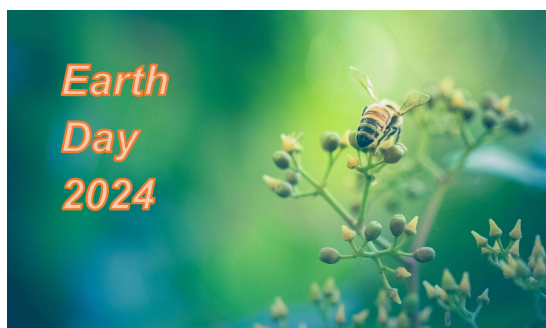
## DID YOU KNOW?

## GOVERNING BOARD MEETING OF MARCH 18, 2024

Governing Board meeting was called to order by President Eddie Jankowski at 6:31 p.m.

Shirley Albers opened with prayer.

Agenda was approved. Consent Agenda was approved MINUS Christian Education, Congregational Life Departments, Finance Committee, and Building and Grounds Department.

- a. Christian Education: Patty Kelly explained the CE has tabled "Fire Drill" implementation because the general safety of all people using our building needs to be addressed by more than CE. Building and Grounds was directed to continue work begun by Robin Murphy in mapping and signage that promotes safety on 3 levels with diverse programs and participant ages and abilities. Patty will share with B&G sample safety plans developed for school settings.
- b. A motion was made and approved to appoint Deb Witmer to Congregational Life Department.
- c. Finance Committee: Correction of "Preliminary Monthly Financial Report for January 2024 will be replaced with the following paragraph as recorded in "Minutes of Finance Committee Meeting 2/15/24:

**Income exceeded expenses for the month of January by \$11,441. Gifts received in January included \$29,080 from the Walsh Fund, and \$1079 from the Busker Family Fund, which were deposited to Miscellaneous Income. A gift was received from the Wheaton Designated Fund in the amount of \$1,090 for use by Building and Grounds.**

President's Report: Eddie thanked Melissa Wikman for chairing last month's meeting in his absence. He also extended special thanks to Sue Vander Haar for her work with the St. Patrick's Day Talent Show and refreshments. Roy and Britta Portenga were also given credit for their prominent role in entertaining the full Fellowship Hall. Personnel and Nominating Committees have not yet been convened.

Minister's Report: In Rev. Vander Haar's absence (member's memorial service in Kalamazoo), Eddie informed the board that FCC's Senior Minister Tim Vander Haar plans to retire in August of 2024 while celebrating 20 years of service at First Congregational Church.

Expenses exceeded income for the month of February by \$9,341. Year-to-date, we have drawn less from Endowment funds for use in operations than budgeted expectations. Actual income and expenses both remain below budget expectations. Since income is much farther below budget expectations than expenses are, the net total/bottom line position is \$21,204 less than where we expected it to be at the close of February.

Outside of our Operating Budget, this fiscal year-to-date we have collected \$67,771 in restricted income and have spent \$236,575 of those restricted funds.
